Tax listing will begin in Transylvania county on Monday, January 3rd, in the eight townships and the books will remain there until January 15th, according to Mrs. Dorothy Mitchell, acting tax super-

After the 15th., the tax books will be in the court house here where property may be listed during the remainder of January.

Pisgah Forest residents can list in that particular township on 7th and 21st, and the eight townships and their listers are as follows

The law requires all property, real and personal, shall be listed in accordance with ownership and value. Businesses and industries are asked to file copies of their inventories


