A member of an old prominent family of Caswell county, Mr. Siddle had many friends and relatives here where he frequently visited.

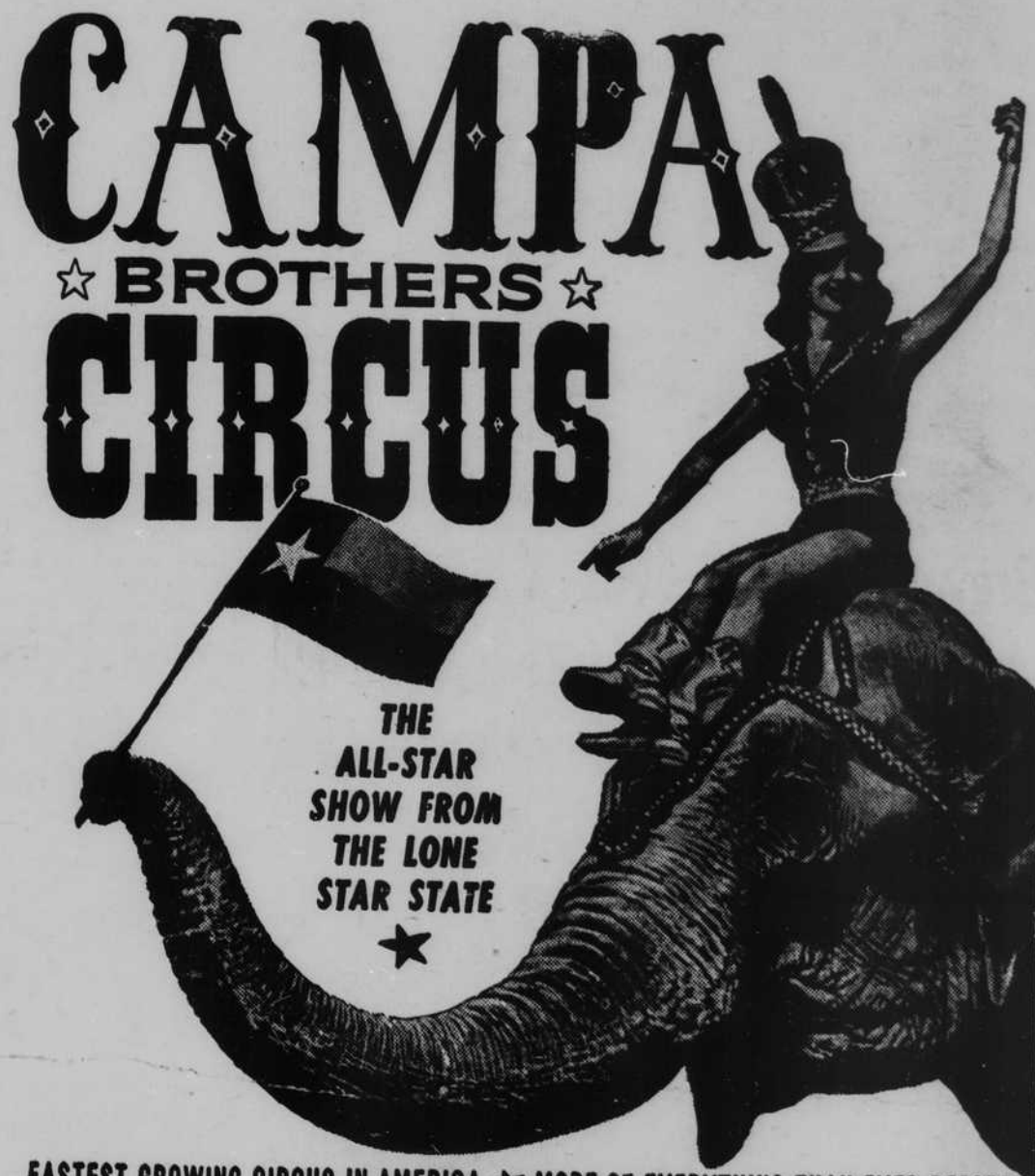
Mr. Siddle had been associated with tobacco warehouses in Danville for the past 18 years.

SKY BROOK FARMS IN RECEIVERSHIP

Two Hendersonville Men Named By Judge Pless To Operate Business

Judge J. Will Pless, of Marion, has issued an order establishing a permanent, operating receivership for Sky Brook Farms, Inc. The order was issued at the request of the corporation in answer to an action brought against it by the Quality Tire Co., of Hendersonville on the allegation of an account due the tire company.

F. V. Hunter of the State Trust company and L. B. Prince, Hendersonville attorney, were named as co-receivers by Judge Pless. They were "empowered to take into their possession and control all and singular the property and assets of the corporation."

The order also directed the co-receivers to "continue the operation of the business as a going concern," and directed an accounting of assets and liabilities to Judge Pless in 30 days.

The corporation owns and operates a frozen food processing plant in Hendersonville and a dairy business.

A lack of operating capital was given as the reason for the request for the receivership in the corporation's answer. The "defendant has been unable to operate its business at full capacity because of a lack of sufficient operating capital," the answer stated.

The answer further stated "that the defendant has assets, real and personal, of the fair market value of more than \$1,000,000 with liabilities amounting to more than \$800,000."

Listed as liabilities in the answer were: a first mortgage held by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation for \$460,000; unsecured claims of approximately \$150,000.
