Blue Devils Win No. 6, Drop Christ School By 9-8 Score

Carl Compton Races 90 Yards For Brevard's TD. Score Is Oddity

Brevard's Blue Devils chalked up victory No. 6 at Christ School last Saturday afternoon.

It was a hard one for the locals and when the final gun was sounded, the score was 9-8 in favor of Brevard.

The score sounds more like a baseball game than football, but two safeties and an extra point made up the queer figures. Each team scored a safety, and the Blue Devils made the extra point that brought them victory.

Brevard has made only four extra points this season and three of them proved to be the winning margin in a game. The Blue Devils defeated Black Mountain 7-6, Asheville School 7-6 and Christ School 9-8.

Carl Compton was the big gun for the Devils and scored their first

marker in the second quarter when he broke through the Christ School line and rambled 90 yards to score. The game-winning extra point was good as Larry Erwin hit the middle of the line for the necessary two yards.

Christ School bounced right back and on a sustained drive of 70 yards, David Howie hit the line for five yards and a TD. The try for the point failed, and Brevard led 7-6.

In the third quarter the Greenies went out front by one point when Carl Compton took a punt near his own goal line and was caught behind the pay dirt stripe trying to evade tacklers.

Brevard forged ahead by one point in the fourth quarter when they chased Tommy Mebane. Christ School back, out of the end one for an automatic safety.

Just prior to the final gun, the Greenies carried the ball over the

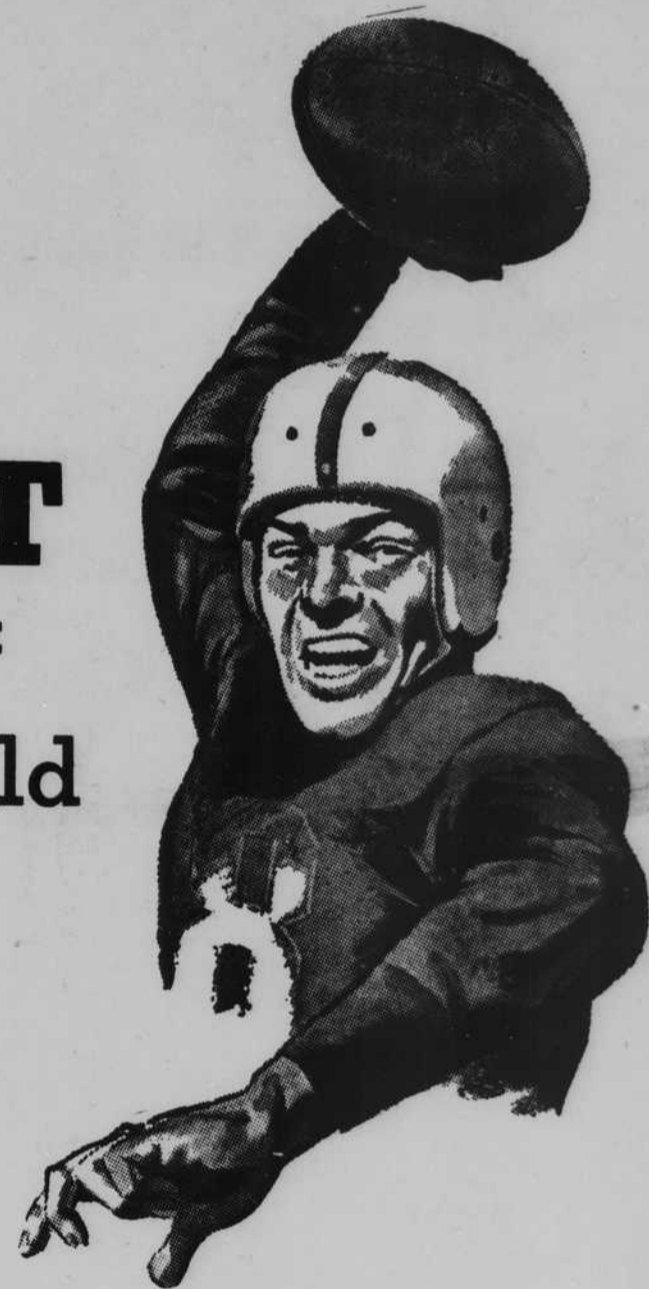
