

Farmers Now Electing PMA Committeemen In Townships

List Of Candidates In Each Area Given. Balloting By Mail

Transylvania farmers are now voting by mail for PMA community committeemen in each of the eight townships of the county.

Ballots, listing 10 candidates in each of the townships, have been mailed out, and they are to be returned by Dec. 8th. On December 14th, the high man in each community—who are the official delegates, will come into the office here and select the county PMA committee.

The secretary, Mrs. Julia Westwood, explains that in each community the farmer receiving the highest number of ballots will be declared the chairman and the next highest will be the vice chairman. The next will be the regular member and so on down to the second alternate, she states. The same applies to the delegates.

The five committeemen in each community serve all during the year, while the delegates only elect the county committee.
