the Brevard college board of trustees, will present the portrait to the college. The Rev. Mr. Hefner is a graduate of Brevard Institute.

Dean J. J. Stevenson, Jr., acting president of the college, will accept the portrait and deliver appropriate remarks.

Representatives from Brevard Institute, Weaver college and Brevard college, all institutions which Prof. Trowbridge has served, will speak at the ceremony. Representing Brevard Institute is Joseph Whisnant, of Shelby; Weaver college, Carlyle Rutledge, of Kannapolis; Brevard college, Lois Frazier, of Brevard.

Included in the ceremony will be special music by Francis B. Price, baritone soloist and voice instructor at the college.

Elizabeth Bridges, young granddaughter of Mrs. J. M. Allison, Sr., of Brevard, will unveil the portrait. Mrs. Allison attended the institute on the first day of its opening.

Following the unveiling service, an informal reception will be given in honor of Prof. and Mrs. Trowbridge in the college formal gardens. A large number of the Trowbridge family is expected for the occasion.

**Kenneth Harris Is Painter**  
The Trowbridge portrait, given to the school by the alumni of the parent institutions of Brevard college—Brevard Institute and Weaver college—was painted by Kenneth Harris, an alumnus of Brevard Institute.

Harris has had exhibitions of his work shown throughout the south. His numerous awards of merit include the coveted award by the American Society of Graphic Arts. He has been commissioned to do paintings for industry and for the U. S. army. He has also been appointed official painter for "Colonial Williamsburg" by the Williamsburg (Va.) Restoration.

He is the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. A. H. Harris and the brother of Mrs. Walter Duckworth, of Brevard.

**Work Of Trowbridge**  
Prof. Trowbridge is known in the south as an authority on mountain education. He was president of Brevard Institute, and later president of Weaver college; and is now vice president emeritus of this institution. He came to Brevard college at its merged opening here in 1934 as vice president. He was head of the college chemistry department, and did additional teaching in the fields of German and religious education.

His retirement was made official at the end of the summer session, 1950. The Trowbridges made their home in Brevard until recently when they moved to the Methodist home in Charlotte.

Speaking of Prof. Trowbridge's work here, Miss Marjorie Craig, professor of English and college historian at Brevard, pointed out the "personal warmth and interest" which characterized his work with students.

The Trowbridge portrait will hang over the entrance from the foyer into the college library, according to Acting President Stevenson.

## TO THE DEMOCRATIC VOTERS OF TRANSYLVANIA COUNTY

### Ladies and Gentlemen:

The end of our little campaign is now in sight and I hear I am being criticized for not having announced any sort of platform. Most every one knows my platform, whether announced or unannounced. You always find me with the masses—usually with the UNDER DOG. I am for democratic government as against RING RULE and I shall state briefly some of the things which, after contacting a large percentage of the Democratic voters both by letter and in person, I am sure will meet their approval.

First: I am in favor of abolishing the present system of electing a few officials whose chief business is to APPOINT those officers whose positions seem to be of greater importance than are the elective ones, and I propose instead of the present system that we make ALL positions whose duties are county-wide in their scope, ELECTIVE OFFICES, each of which is to be filled by a duly elected officer, responsible to you—the voter—for tenure in his respective position. These would include Co. Supt. of Schools, Supt. Public Welfare, County Farm Demonstration Agent and County Attorney. Since each of these positions is now held by a Democrat I am sure there will be no objection from them to making these positions elective.

Second: I am in favor of working out the Old Age Assistance in a way to give proper consideration and assistance to all deserving old people who are now eligible or who may hereafter become eligible for these benefits.

Third: I have heretofore expressed myself favorable to those things in which our school teachers are interested; having served in the ranks of that group for several years.

Fourth: The matter of the purchase of Class Rings for our graduating young folks and also their uniforms, robes or whatever they may properly be called—I find a feeling among some of the dads and mothers that they, as well as the boys and girls, are being "gypped" by some "city slicker" (or some other type slicker) who is overcharging for these items. And I find, after some investigation and correspondence, that these suspicions seem to be well founded. By dealing directly with the manufacturer, the class president, or officials of the P. T. A. can, according to information I shall be glad to make available to them, accomplish a saving of from 40 per cent to 50 per cent, which would seem quite considerable on a purchase involving around a thousand dollars total.

What we can do about any of the foregoing depends, of course, on the results of Saturday's primary election. As your senator I am sure I can be of assistance to you in a much more tangible manner than would be possible were I not your senator. This contest now shifts to your shoulders. May each one bear his part nobly and may there be no mistakes in the results.
