Catch Is Averaging 6.4. Extreme Caution Urged Since Woods Are Dry

In spite of high winds and cold weather, fishing is good here on the Davidson river in the Pisgah National Forest, officials state.

Already some 900 fishermen have cast their lines into the tumbling cold waters of the Davidson, and the catch is averaging 6.4, which is much better than last season.

The Davidson is open on Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday, and fishermen are urged to be extremely fire conscious since the woods are so dry.
