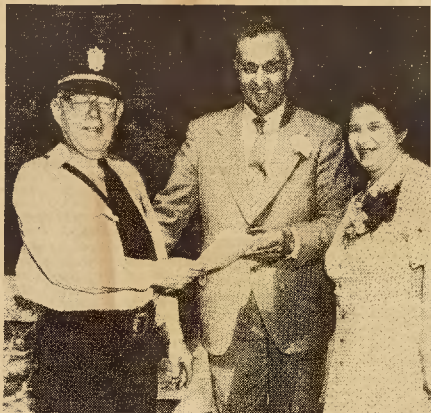


**New York Couple Guests Here**
