Hospital Patients Get Special Diets

If you're a patient at the hospital and balk at your food, take a look at the card that is on every tray. It may be that you're getting a special diet.

These diets are prescribed by doctors for a particular illness of a patient and they are given individual attention in the kitchen. Some patients cannot have sugar in their food, others no salt, while some require liquid or soft diets.

The color of the card with each tray is a guide to the diet. A blue card is for regular, green signifies liquid, pink is for special, etc.

Hospital Rules Are Followed To The Letter, No Exceptions

No Medicines Or Treatment Given Without Doctor's Orders. Strict Visit Hours

About the only hospital rules at the Transylvania Community

hospital with which patients and visitors are familiar are those that have to do with visiting hours.

There are more, but not many, and they must be followed. Many people do not know, or pretend not to know, for instance, that only under a doctor's orders can anyone be admitted as a patient. The hospital reports that occasionally someone will try to enter without authority and has to be turned down. Sometimes they are sick enough to need hospital care, but it's not unknown for a person to want to take a vacation on his hospital insurance.

No medicines or treatment are given at the local hospital except on doctor's orders.

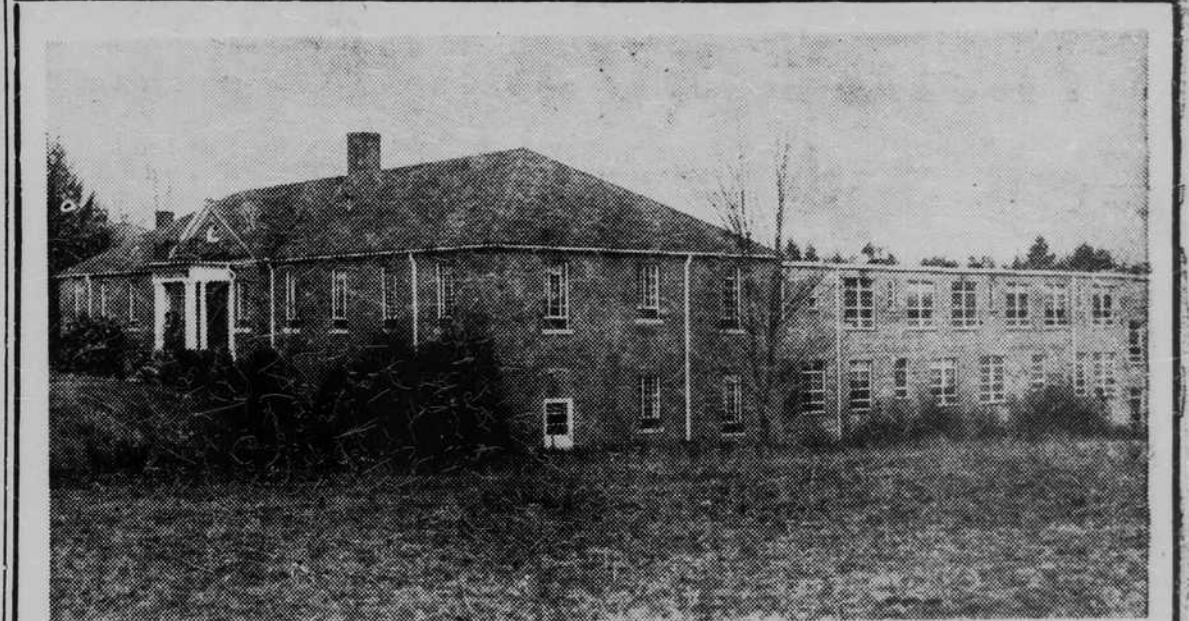
Once patients have been admitted they can be discharged only upon doctor's orders. They just don't walk out whenever they feel like it. The doctors also prescribe diets and medicines, and while a patient may not always get the food he wants, his meals have been prepared on instructions from his physician.

For their own protection, children under 12 years of age cannot go to the hospital as visitors.

Visiting is permitted at the Transylvania Community hospital during certain hours in the mornings, afternoons and evenings. The new schedule will be posted when the addition is opened this week end. For the sake of the patient and hospital routine, it is imperative that visitors abide by the schedule.

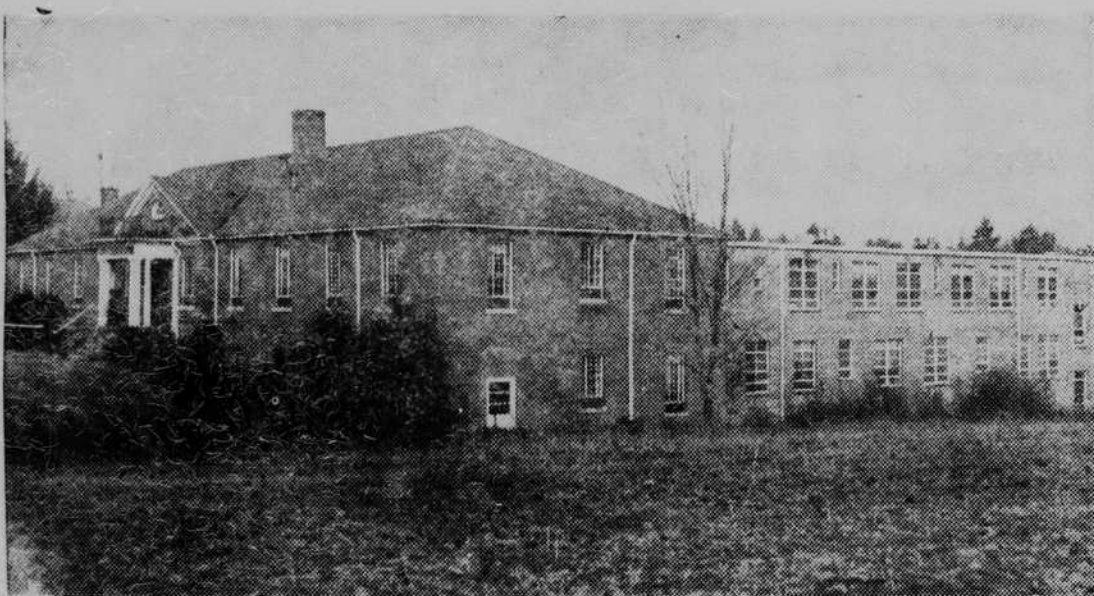
