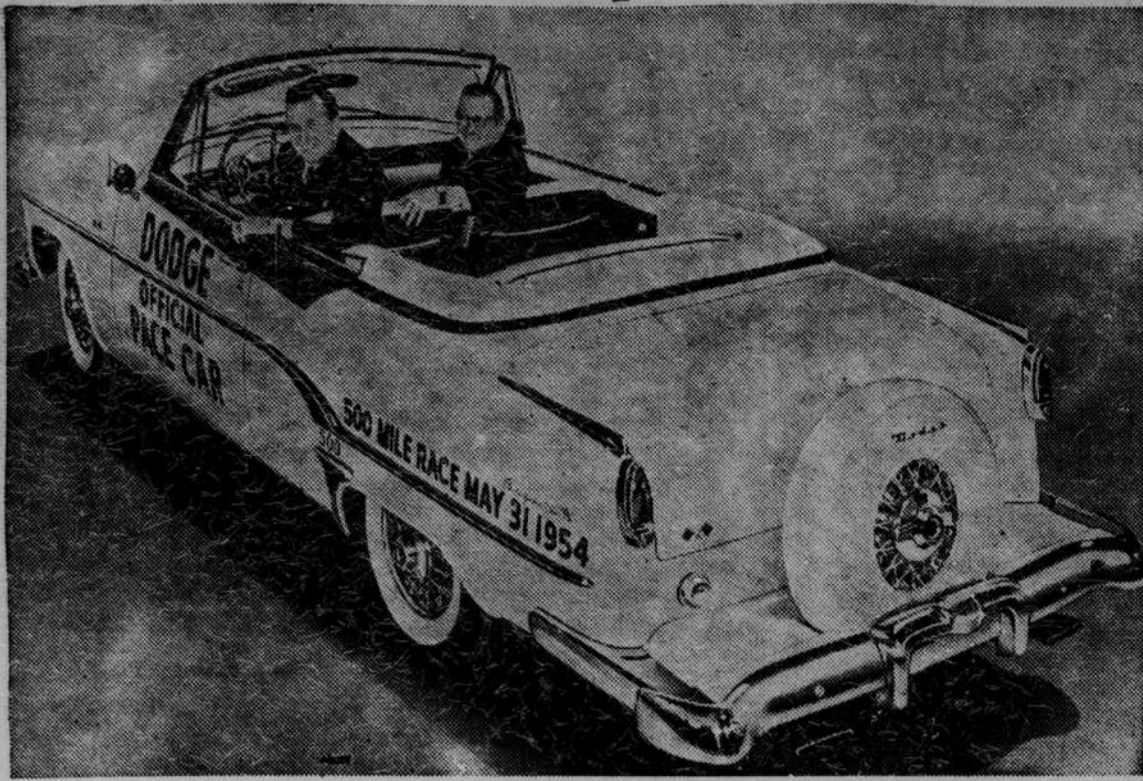


Dodge To Pace Indianapolis 500-Mile Race
