**Cemetery Clean-Up Success**  
Some 60 people gathered Saturday on the hill where lie the remains of the early pioneers of Little River valley. The Orr cemetery, one of the oldest in the county, was cleaned by the hands of descendants and valley folks. The ancient markers were subjects of great interest and reminiscence as legends were brought to light by some of the older folks present, the legends of slaves and Indian graves said to be buried in the cemetery. The oldest markers to be identified dated back to 1808. At 12 o'clock a lunch was spread by the ladies which turned out to be a "feast." At 12:30 from a radio in a nearby car the workers listened to Community Hour, which was being broadcast from WPNF, and featured the Cedar Mountain Community club. Then the work resumed. Next Saturday the Orr cemetery is to be leveled and seeded. The work when completed is estimated to be valued at more than \$500.
