#### SAVING LIVES

The improved system of hurricane forecasting has saved untold numbers of lives. #### DISASTER AREA

As a result of Hurricane Connie's destruction, the Small Business administration declared ten Eastern North Carolina counties eligible for disaster loans. The counties are Brunswick, New Hanover, Pender, Onslow, Carteret, Pamlico, Craven, Jones, Beaufort and Lenoir. Loan offices are being established by SBA in New Bern and Wilmington. These disaster loans are made at a low interest rate of three per cent.

On March 25, I introduced bill in the senate, which was cosponsored by Senator Scott, to authorize an appropriation of \$5,000,000 to repair hurricane damage along the coast of North Carolina as a result of Hurricane Hazel. This bill is pending in the congress, awaiting studies by the budget bureau and other agencies of the government. I hope that something can be accom-plished in the next session for hurricane aid.




