Mr. Jenkins said the beds should be mulched for winter protection. He also told of effective sprays to be used for protection against dis-

The speaker stated that roses are universal plants, possibly millions of years old, and are the most satisfactory plants to be grown with continuous bloom. A large number of roses from Mr. Jenkins' garden were on display. He urged all garden club members to try to grow roses as a very satisfactory and rewarding hobby.


