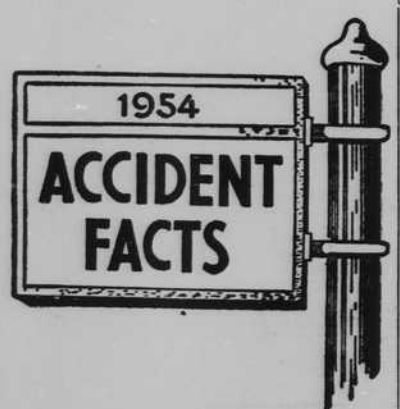
It was announced that next month there will be a cake walk and pie eating contest with everyone invited to attend.
