# Total Of \$35,000 In Sight In Brevard College Development Fund Campaign

Chairman Garrett Is Hope- Light Session ful That Goal Of \$50,-000 Oversubscribed

Excellent response is reported in the current Brevard College Development Fund campaign by Director Ed B. Garrett.

Early reports indicate that \$35,000 of the goal of \$50,000 is now in sight.

Chairman Garrett says he hopes that the canvassers, numbering some 35 strong will turn in additional pledges and contributions to him this week end.


