Coach Milner succeeds Wayne Bradburn, who was recently elected superintendent of schools, succeeding J. B. Jones, who is retiring.

Principal Kimzey was high in his recommendation of Mr. Milner.

"He not only possesses all the qualifications of a good coach, but he is also an excellent teacher," Mr. Kimzey declared.

Mr. Milner came to Brevard last year from Waynesville as assistant and line coach here. He is a former All-America football player and starred in college football at the University of South Carolina and at Duke.

The formal opening of the Brevard Miniature golf course, located adjacent to the Chatterbox, is set during the week from April 18 through the 27th.

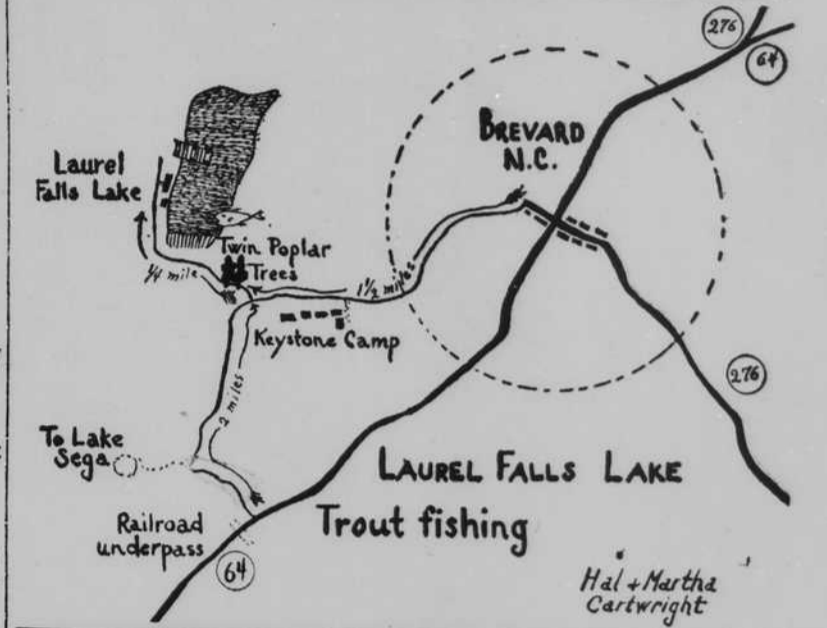
