will be long at that time. During the month of January, all county property and farm reports must be listed. The tax supervisor says there is a penalty prescribed by law for failure to do so.

Property that must be listed falls into three major categories:

1. All real estate and tangible personal property owned on Janury 1st, 1958. 2. A poll, or capitation, tax re-

quired of all male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 as of the first of the New Year. 3. Every dog, male or female. more than six months old owned or
