180 Persons On Rolls. Adding Local Employees From Time To Time

GROGAN QUOTED

The Du Pont plant at Buck For-est "is about complete and operations are expected to start within a few months," according to the company's annual report for 1957 made to 200,000 Du Pont stockholders.

Leslie S. Grogan, manager of the new plant for the production of hyper-pure silicon, estimated that construction of the plant was 'about 90 per cent" completed.

The plant manager said that production runs were underway to est and break in equipment, and that silicon produced was being used for training. He added that, as yet, no product was being shipped to customers from the Brevard plant.

"There are now 180 persons on the plant operating force," Mr. Grogan said. "We are still adding to our rolls, and for the most part we are employing local people. All of our management group from other locations have moved into the

The operating force has compiled the beginning of what Mr. Gregan hopes will be an outstanding safety record. The plant worked throughout a lengthy training period, or more than 200 days for the entire erce, without a time-losing injury.

Besides finishing touches to the one-story brick operating building, work going on at the plant includes landscaping. Final surfacing of the entrance road and parking lot will get underway soon. A pole flying

The plant has a rated capacity of Group Encouraging Reading 50,000 pounds of semi-conductor grade and 20,000 pounds of solarcell grade silicon annually. Semi-
