

Transylvania's schools opened on schedule this week, and a full day of activities began on Wed-

An increase in total enrollment was noted over last year's opening, and the largest number of students in history was reported at Brevard high school.

According to district principal, Robert Kimzey, the number of students attending on Wednesday morning was 727.

Total enrollment in the Transylvania school system was reported by Supt. Wayne Bradburn as being 3,952. Last year the schools opened with 3,902 students.

Supt. Bradburn expects the total figure to approach 4,000 during the next few days.

The enrollment at the other schools was: Penrose-317; Straus -391; Rosman elementary-502; Rosman high - 277; T. C. Henderson - 216; Brevard elementary-1,017; Pisgah Forest-289; and Rosenwald - 216.

In addition to Brevard high, other schools reporting a sizeable increase in enrollment included Rosman high school, Brevard elementary and Rosenwald, Mr. Bradburn stated.
