Vets Of World War I To Meet

James E. Dayton, of Asheville, senior vice commander of the North Carolina Department, Veterans of World War 1 of the U.S.A. will be the chief speaker at a rally of World War I veterans in Polk and surrounding counties Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock here in Columbus, at the Polk county

Headquarters of the World War I organization is located in Washington, D. C., while the state headquarters is located in Salisbury. During the 85th Congress the group of World War I veterans was chartered by the Congress. Since that time their membership has almost doubled with more than 1800 local barracks, with 106 in North Carolina.

By action of the 6th national convention in Springfield, Illinois, Sept. 14-17, they have been mandated to seek a pension for their group which is now averaging 64 years of age. Approved for consideration by the 86th Congress is H. R. 1181, sponsored by Rep. James E. VanZandt of Pennsylvania which would increase present benefits for the veterans of 1917-18 and at the same time increase the present in-

come limitations. Dayton, Stated today, that countless thousands of World War I veterans are dependent upon relatives for the bare necessities of life. Others are finding it difficult te compete in the present day labor market due to age and physical handicaps. The time has come when something should be done for the "Forgotten generations of veterans". Dayton added.
