## Mayor, **Police** Busy

A look at the records at the city hall reveals that Mayor B. W. Thomason and the Brevard police department have been busy since he took office on May 2nd of this year.

In all, there have been 426 persons brought in for trial.

A total of 172 persons has been tried for public drunkenness in Mayor's court during the past seven months, and 40 have appeared before Mr. Thomason for drunk driving.

Violation of the prohibition aw comes next with 29 being arrested on this charge.

Some 27 persons were nabbed for operating a vehicle with improper muffle, and 26 were brought in for disorderly conduct.

Speeding charges totaled 22, and there were 19 other violations of general traffic regulations. Reckless driving charges have been brought against 12.




