

Solving Safe Robbery Election Board Adopts Resolution Calling For New Registration Here

After an intense investigation which lasted over a period of several days, the Brevard police department, members of the sheriff's depart-ment of the State Bureau of Investigation arrested six persons in connection with the recent robbery of a safe at the Brevard Crest store that contained over \$5,000 in money and checks.

Police Chief W. S. "Bill" Thurston said they are James Kenneth Gravley, 20, Steven Powell, 16, Jacob Leevon Bailey, 17, Mrs. Bertha Patterson, 40, and B. F. Patterson, 40.

The chief said the Pattersons' 13-year-old son is being held for juvenile authorities. He said the boy helped carry the 350 - pound safe out the back door of the building. Chief Thurston and SBI

agent P. R. Kitchen found the missing safe last week in the shoals of East Fork Creek. With Deputy Sheriff Claude Melton, Thurston said he later arrested one of the suspects, who confessed and implicated the others.
