
Brevard Campus Cross Commemorates Dr. E. K. McLarty, Sr.

A new cross has been placed beside the lily pool at the east end of the main quadrangle of the Brevard College campus. Given to the college by friends of the late Dr. E. K. McLarty, Sr., father of Brevard's president, the memorial will commemorate Dr. McLarty's work in the western region of the state.

A plaque mounted on the base of the seventeen-foot cross bears the following inscription: "To the glory of God and memory of Emmett Kennedy McLarty, Sr., 1869-1959, Minister in the Western North Carolina Annual Conference of The Methodist Church for more than fifty

In expressing his appreciation for the gift to the college, President McLarty said, "The religious character of the college needs continual visthe expression, and it is believed that the erection of the new cross will witness centrality of the Christian principles upon which the institution is founded.

It is expected that the new memorial cross will provide a center for traditional voluntary worship services at Christmas time and during Holy Week.

According to the official weather station at WPNF, a low three degrees below zero was reported and other low temperatures in the county were as follows:

Olin - two below Do Pont - two above

Pisgah National Forest (lower elevations) - three below; Mt. Pisgah - 23 below

One tragic fire was attributed to the cold weather Wednesday morning when the Ralph Fisher house near Mitchem's Lake burned to the ground. Mr. and Mrs. Fisher and their five children barely escaped from the roaring

The Fisher residence fire was the first in a series Wednesday morning.
