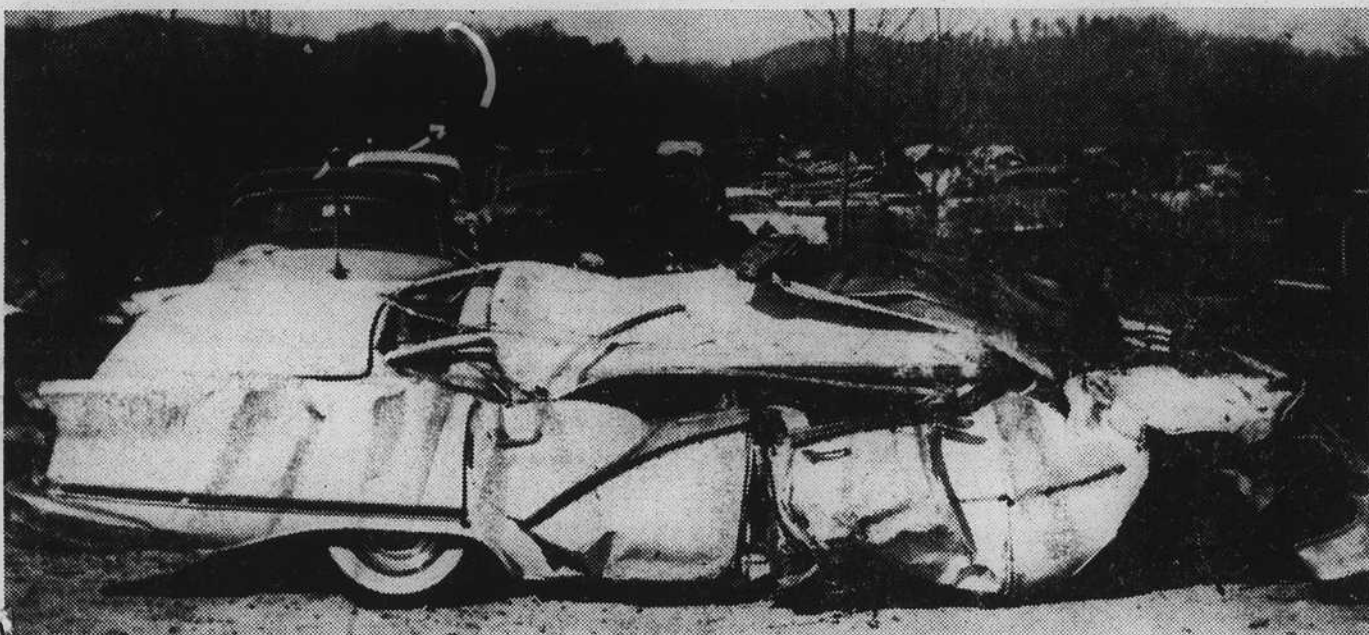

Brevard Meets Reidsville In Asheville Saturday Afternoon

Game Will Be At Memorial Stadium, 2 P.M.

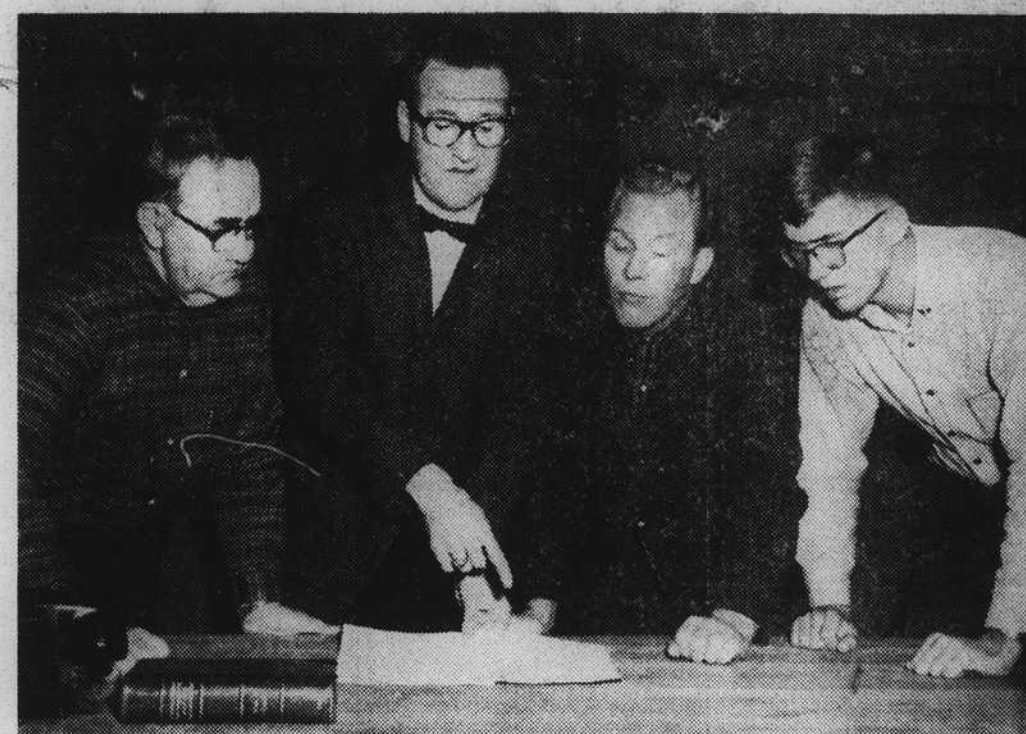
The Brevard Blue Devils, champions of the Blue Ridge conference and Region 2 of the North Carolina High School Athletic Activities association, will journey to Asheville Saturday to play the Reidsville Golden Lions for the Western AAA title.

Brevard will be defending the title that they won last year by defeating Greensboro Bessemer at Greensboro in the championship game.

Brevard and Reidsville will clash in Asheville's Memorial Stadium at 2:00 p.m. Saturday afternoon, and hundreds of Blue Devil followers are expected to be on hand for the big play-off game.

The Golden Lions, coached by former Wake Forest great, Bo Saerinty, bring a 7-2-2 record into the play-offs. They whipped previously undefeated West Alamance 18-7 last Friday night to earn the right to meet the Blue Devils in the AAA finals.

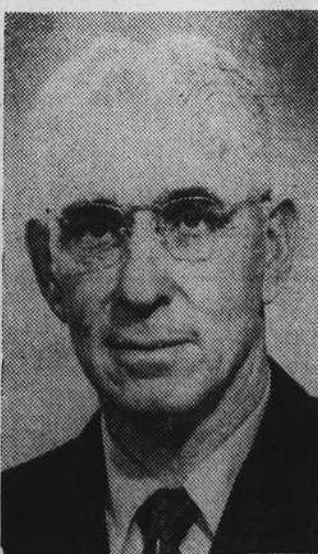
According to Charles L. Russell, who is in charge of arrangements for the important dinner meeting, trophies will be awarded to the most outstanding Blue Devils on the 1963 team.

The banquet will be held in the Ecusta cafeteria, beginning at 7:00 o'clock.

Company officials are high pleased to have Mr. Perry as the speaker for the occasion.

He is recognized as one of the most outstanding leaders in the field of athletics in North Carolina, and he has the reputation of being a forceful and dynamic speaker.

Mr. Perry has held his present post since 1948, and prior to that time he was a prominent high school coach for 19 years. He also served as superintendent



of schools for 13 years and a high school principal for five years.

He was at Reidsville and Mt. Olive.

For some 20 years, "Hap" Perry was a prominent referee of college and university football games across the nation.

The First Citizens Bank and Trust company will begin construction of an ultra-modern building here immediately, Lewis R. Holding, the president, announces today.

L. E. Bagwell, of Brevard, has been named the general contractor, and J. N. Pease Associates, architects and engineers, have completed plans and specifications.

Henry C. McDonald, of Brevard, will be the supervising architect.

The building will be contemporary architectural in design and will be of steel frame and masonry construction. The pre-cast concrete outside panels will have a white quartz appearance, and much glass paneling, in amber color, will be used.

According to President Holding, the cost of the building will be in excess of \$100,000.00.

The site for the building, which is opposite the Brevard post office on South Broad street, was purchased from Mrs. Lila Wenzlick, and the residential building on it has been demolished.

Clearing of the grounds began on Wednesday by Allen Smith.
