

Civilians who receive their absentee ballot must find some official with a seal who is authorized to administer oaths usually a notary public. 1. Mark the ballots or have them marked for him in his following Saturday, January presence and under his instruc- 11th, will be challenge day.

2. Fold each ballot separate-

3. Place each ballot in the container-envelope and seal it.

4. Fill in and sign the affidavit printed on the container-return envelope.

5. Have the officer attest the eath by affixing his signature and seal. This performance being completed, the next step is to insure that the ballot is properly mailed to the chairman of the county board of elections.

The absentee ballot must be in the chairman's hands by 12 c'clock noon on the Saturday before the election in order to be counted, unless the voter has become suddenly ill or disabled within five days of the election, in which event his ballot may be received by the chairman by 3 p. m. on election day, either by mail or by delivery by a member of the voter's immediate family.


