"Really only a few of us Americans realize," Mrs. Turne said, "that every year in our country we have a quarter of million infants born with serious birth defects. At leas, 30,000 are still born or die of these defects. To put it another way this means that one infant of every 16 has a serious defect, and that about every tenth American family experiences the tragedy and suffering caused by the birth of a seriously defective child. Only accidents cause more crippling among children."

Turning to the subject of arthritis, Mrs. Turner added: "Here also the statistics are shocking and breathtaking. Fully 11 million of us suffer from the arthritic diseases.
