Drive To Stamp Out Polio In County Begins Jan. 12

(Continued From Page One) and it helps break the chain of transmission by stimulating intestinal resistance to future infection."

Polio is caused by any one of the three types of virus. The government last year licensed an oral vaccine against Types I and II and recently granted a license for distribution of oral vaccine against Type III. All three of the oral vaccines were developed by Dr. Albert B. Sabin of the University of Cincinnati School of Medicine.

The vaccine will be administered at six immunization centers in strategic locations throughout Transylvania county. The vaccine can be administered to infants by dropper, spoon or paper cup. Older children and adults can drink a mixture of vaccine and distilled water or eat a cube of sugar on which the vaccine has been dropped.

A contribution of 25 cents per dose is being requested, but no one will be refused the vaccine if unable to contribute.

Registration procedures will be simplified if families will fill out in advance the registration forms being distributed throughout the county and bring them to the clinics nearest them.

The vaccine will be dispensed January 12th from noon until

6:00 p.m. at the following places: T. C. Henderson school, Rosman school, Brevard Junior High school, Straus school, Penrose school, Olin Medical Center.

Volunteers who have been enlisted to help in the clinics will meet at the Brevard Junior High school, Sunday, January 5th, at 2:00 o'clock.
