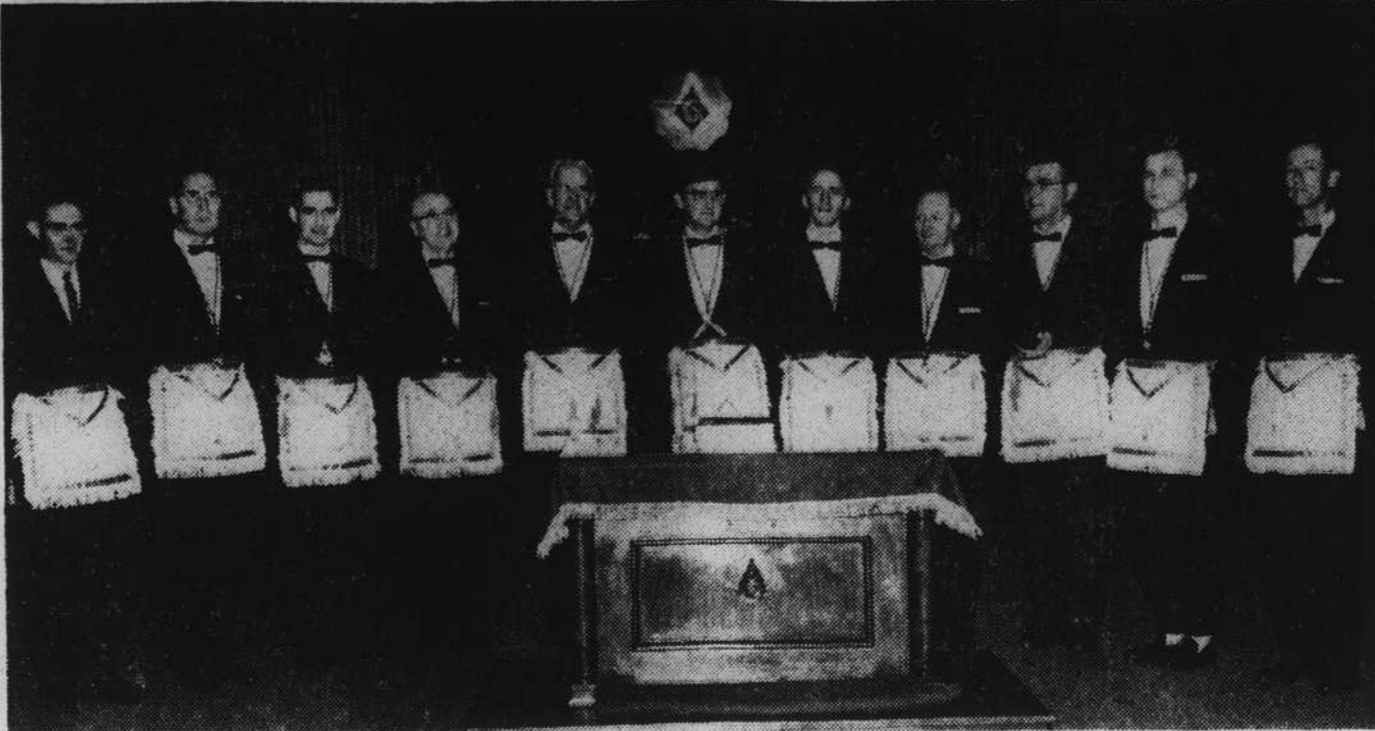
She referred to the visitors in Jerusalem as pilgrims instead of tourists, since most of them are pastors, priests, nuns, etc.
