

Survey Is Made Of The Subsidy **Program Locally**

How much is being spent each month in Transylvania county for public assistance? How does the local aid program compare with that in other parts of the country?

Answers to these questions are now possible, thanks to breakdown figures that have just become available, for the first time, in a Government report. It was issued by the Bureau of Family

It shows the proportion of people being helped and the size of that help in every section of the

Data is given on the three major subsidy programs that are being operated by the states with local funds, augmented by Federal aid. They are old-age grants, aid to families with dependent children and aid to the permanently and totally disabled.

The report emphasizes the state and local nature of each of them, as well as the wide range in number of people helped and the size of payments as between the various states and within

In Transylvania county, it is shown, old-age assistance is going to 202 men and women, out of a total population of

On the average, they are getting checks in the amount of \$37 a month. This compares with \$73 per month throughout the Unit-—Turn to Page Four
