## 432 Transylvanians Reported On Payrolls Of Government

How many Transylvania county residents are holding down government jobs-Federal, state and local? How many of them are connected with the public administration

part of government? A special report, just released by the Department of Commerce, presents a social and economic portrait of workers in the United States and of the hundreds of types of work they perform. It is called "Occupational Characteristics."

From this and from other data on the subject, compiled by the Census Bureau, it appears that there are 432 local residents employed in civilian capacities by various governmental bodies.

Of these, 98 work for agencies of government whose activities come under the head of public administration, Included in this category are those with legislative, judicial and executive functions and, in addition, those in the postal service.

In terms of the total number of working people in Transylvania County, the proportion in public administration is equivalent to 19 per 1.000



The bids will be evaluated immediately, and according to company officials, the contract could he let by April 1st.

It is hoped that construction could then be started immediately.
