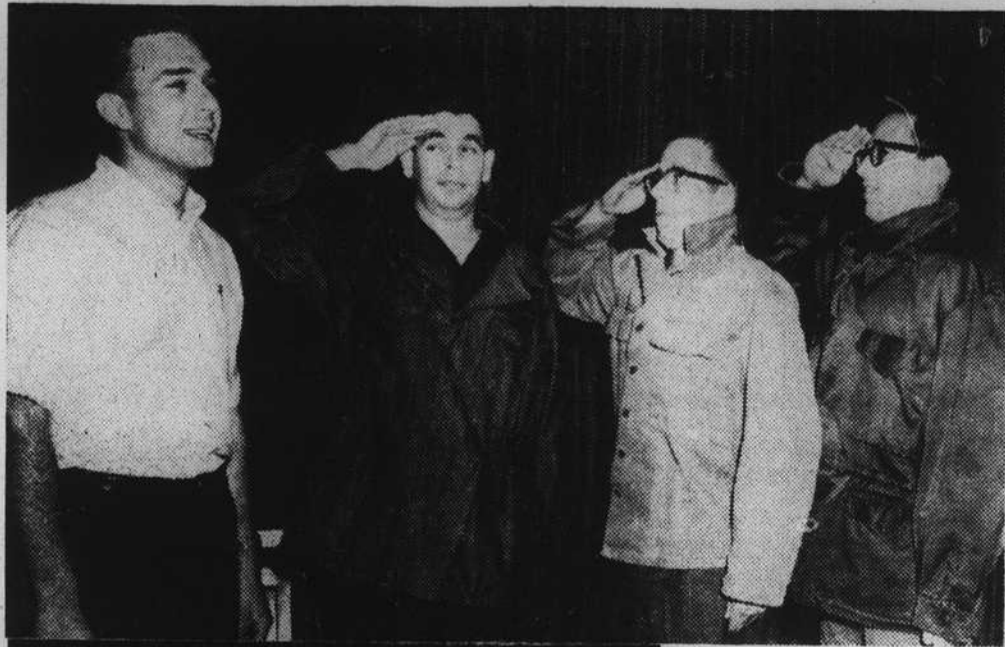

'64 Concert Schedule At Brevard Music Center Expanded, Announced

Many Renowned Artists Signed For Appearance

The schedule of programs for a summer of music at the Brevard Music Center has been released by Dr. James Christian Pfohl, director of the Center.

The season will open on Sunday, June 28th, and continue through Sunday, September 6th.

Appearing in concert will be world-renowned artists, including Leonard Pennario, Jan Peerce, Ruth Slenczynska, Aaron Rosand, Arlene Saunders, Morley Meredith, and David Lloyd.

Included in the program will be two operas by the Turnau Opera Players.

The membership drive for the 1964 season is also underway with Wolfgang Selle and Mrs. Betty Killian as co-chairmen of the committee with Eric Klein and Ray Childers.

Prices are the same as last season. Patron memberships, two tickets, are \$100. Sponsor memberships, two tickets, are \$50. A single sponsor membership, one ticket, is \$30.

Simultaneously with the membership drive is a drive to raise \$25,000 for the building fund. This will help with the construction of the new auditorium which is expected to be in use before the season is over, and for paving roads and parking areas.

"A Seat for a Song" is still being offered to those who wish to purchase seats at \$25.00 each. A brass plaque will carry the name designated by the donor.

Applicants must have been accepted at Brevard college and must show evidence of character, scholastic ability, intellectual promise, demonstration of ambition and leadership ability, and need.

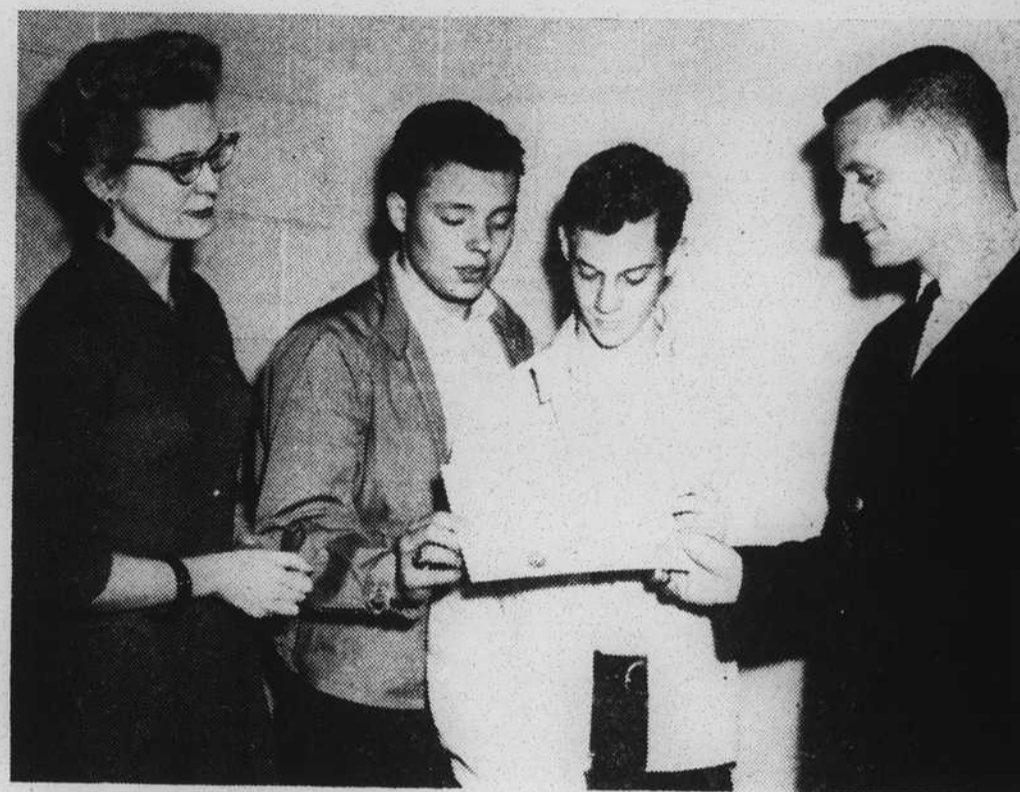
