

First Highway Fatality, '64

Transylvania county's first traffic fatality of the year occurred Monday.

Two-month old Ricky Lance, of Brevard, was killed when the car driven by his mother, Mrs. Henry Lance, was struck head-on by another car driven by Jesse M. Breedlove of Lake Toxaway.

According to Patrolman C. L. Cappell, who investigated, Mrs. Lance was driving east on U.S. 64 when the accident occurred. She and her sister, Mrs. Thelma Galloway, were injured in the collision and were taken to Transvlvania Community hospital. Both are in "satisfactory"

Mr. Breedlove has been charged with manslaughter and reckless driving. He was also injured in the accident and was sent to the Veterans' Hospital in Oteen. He underwent surgery Wednesday morning. His condition prior to the operation was described by hospital officials as "serious".
