The paper will be published on Tuesday, and deadline for advertising, classifieds and news is 5:00 o'clock Monday afternoon, Nov. 22nd.

The newspapers will go in the mails on the following day and delivery will be made prior to Thanksgiving.

According to Postmaster C. Y. Patton, Jr., here at the Brevard post office, Thanksgiving day, Nov. 25th, will be a holiday. There will be no delivery on rural or city routes.

The Transylvania school system will have a two-day holiday for Thanksgiving, closing when schools are recessed next Wednesday and reopening on Monday, Nov. 29th.
