Raise 115.1% Of Goal

Transylvania Responds Generously In The 1966 United Fund Campaign

Transylvania county has one of the best records of giving than any other town or city in the 1966 United Fund campaign.

The local goal was \$37,200. Subscribed or pledged to date is the following amount—\$42,890.93, or 115.1 per cent.

"This is most gratifying, because we are now in a position to handle any emergency that might arise," Dr. Wilburn Davis, the campaign director, said.

"Our people have certainly given their fair share, and we are most appreciative," Dr. Davis declared.

Actually, the goal of \$37,200 was a reduced figure from requests because many of the agencies requested larger amounts than were allocated in the final budget.

The fine response of the people of Brevard and Transylvania will make the work of the United Fund officials somewhat easier during the coming year.

Dr. Davis emphasized that the great majority of the money raised in the campaign will go for local humanitarian purposes.

He also landed the work of all the division captains, the solicitors, the press, the radio and all other persons who worked in behalf of the successful campaign.

Total amounts received from some of the larger industries of the county were reported today by Bill Overholt, the executive secretary of the UF.

"It is no time to be complacent about TB," Miss Strasser stated. "Although great strides have been made in decreasing the death rate since the advent of anti-tuberculosis drugs, the case rate increased last year in North Carolina and in the nation as well."

"As long as the tuberculosis germ harbors in seemingly well people, there will always be the danger of breakdown and spread of the disease," Miss Strasser continued.

Feaster Is Transylvania's Nominee For Morehead Grant

Marshall Feaster, III, Brevard high school senior, has been named Transylvania's nominee in the John Motley Morehead scholarship program at the University of North Carolina.

The announcement of Feaster's selection to represent this county in the annual award competition was made by Dr. Carol L. Grahl, Transylvania committee chairman.

Young Feaster will compete with other outstanding high

school seniors of Western North Carolina at the district finals in Asheville in January.

He was chosen by the local committee over four other Brevard high school seniors. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. M. M. Feaster, Jr.

Other applicants were: Thomas Eugene Ramsay, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Ramsay; Gary Himes, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles F. Himes; John K. Tinsley, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. E.

The program of the group is concerned with (1) health education and information, (2) medical research (contributing to the 5 projects in North Carolina) and (3) case finding and services to the patient. The district office estimates that there are several hundred persons eligible in Transylvania for benefits but are unaware of it.

The office cannot contact these persons because they do not have names and addresses.
