Soil Survey In County Is Completed

Fransylvania county has quietly been under way for the past three years, but will likely require another two years befort it becomes available to the public. According to Merrimon Shuford, of the U. S. Soil Conservation service, the survey will give useful information about the soil of every acre of land in the

This survey is being made by soil surveyors of the U. S. Soil Conservation Service and the U. S. Forest Service. When the survey is completed there will be available to any who are interested, a detailed map showing the location and extent of the many different kinds of soil occur throughout the

In addition to the map, there will be descriptions of each soil and information about them that will point out their properties, such as depth, texture, permeability, wetness, overflow hazard, slepe and erosion.

This soil survey should be a valuable report to many people in the county. Among the possible users of this report are farmers, planners, builders, developers, contractors, appraisers, real estate brokers, foresters and many others who use the land and need to know more
