McDevitt On The World's Biggest Warship

Airman Ronald H. McDevitt, USN, son of Mrs. Verona I. McDevitt, of Rosman, has reported aboard the world's largest warship, the nuclear powered attack aircraft carrier Enterprise.

The 90,000-ton warship has just completed 30 days "on the line" as a Seventh Fleet attack carrier conducting air strikes against supply routes and military complexes in North Vietnam.
