

Mayor A. M. Sisk Is Unopposed In Rosman's Town Election, 2nd

Incumbent Mayor A. M. Sisk was the only person filing for the mayor's post in the May 2nd municipal election at Rosman. The deadline for filing was noon April 22.

Mr. Sisk, who has served previously as an alderman, served one year of the term of the late Austin Hogsed and also for the past two years.

Carlos Pangle and Donald Lee Butler, incumbents, also filed as aldermen along with A. P. Bell, Jr., who has been serving as alderman since the resignation of Morris Jarrett in November.

This will be the third term for Pangle and the second term for Butler.

Challenge Day is set for Saturday, April 29.

The election will be held in the community center with Besie Pangle as registrar and W. J. Moore and Mrs. J. E. Osborne as judges.
