New Drugs

According to Dr. R. F. Behlow, Extension Veterinarian, North Carolina State University, Raleigh.

"A new drug Poloxalene (Bloat Guard) is effective in controlling legume bloat. This drug is incorporated into a molasses block for controlling bloat. This drug can be safely fed to all cattle - including lactating dairy cows. No withdrawal period is required.

No other salt or mineral blocks can be used when Bloat Guard is used because the consumption of the drug is controlled by the salt in the block.
