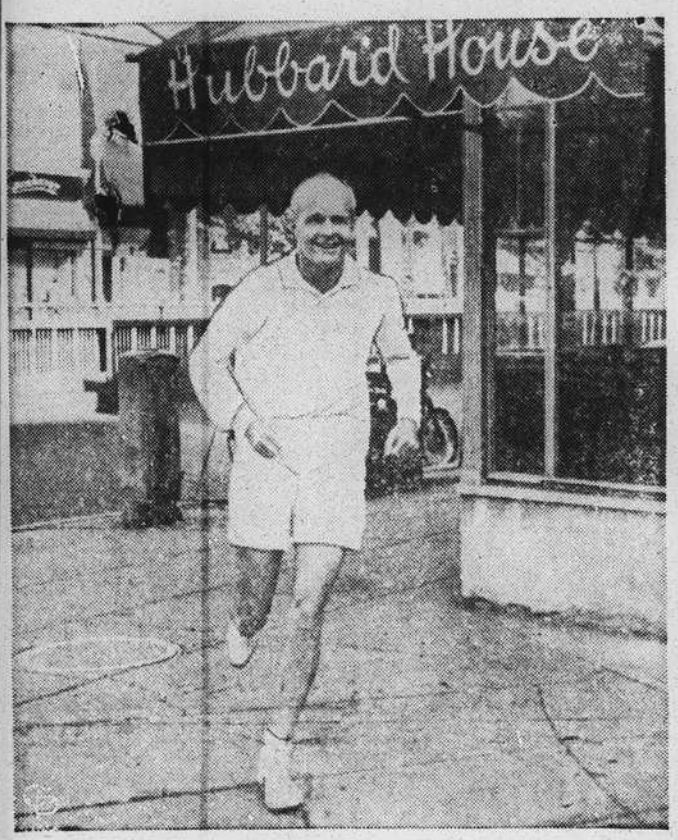
# Gill Thomas Is New US Commissioner For County

Mr. and Mrs. Judson McCrary and family returned Saturday from a week's vacation at Daytona Beach.

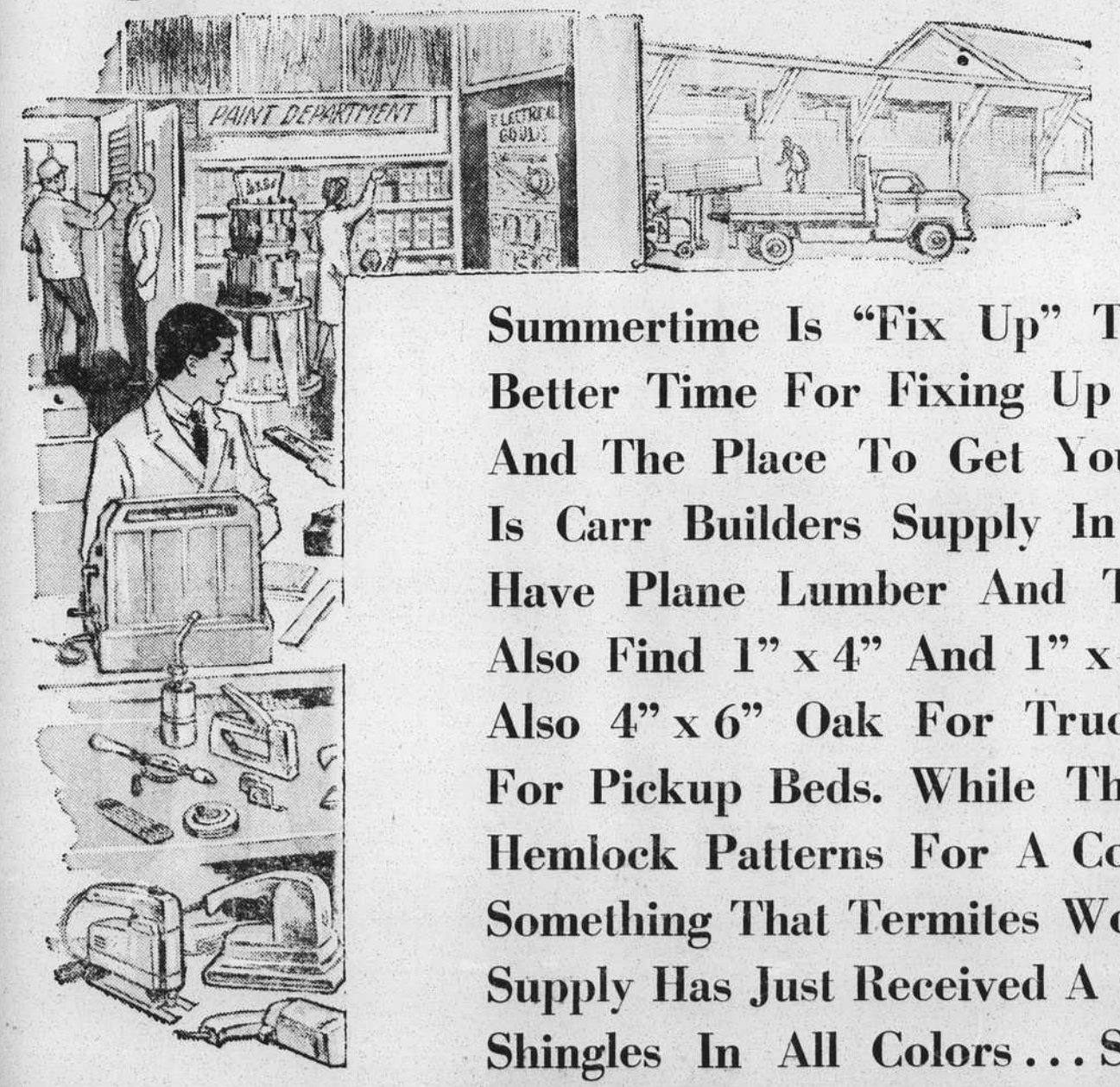
Paul Georges, of Daytona Beach, visited in Brevard over the weekend.
