New Faculty Appointments At Brevard College Are Announced

Ten new faculty appointments at Brevard College were announced today by Dr. J. Braxton Harris, Dean of the College.

Col. William N. Beard will serve as an instructor in the department of mathematics. Col. Beard, a native of New Bern, attended Wake Forest College and received the B. S. degree from the United States Military Academy at West Point. He has 30 graduate hours at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Upon his retirement from the United States Army, he received the M. A. T. degree from Duke University.

His wife, Mrs. Sarah S. Beard, will teach English. Mrs. Beard received both the A.B. and M.A. degrees from Duke University. She has taught in the high schools of Hampton, Virginia, and has worked in intelligence for the United States Air Force.

Mrs. Irene Moser joins the library staff as an assistant. A native of Swannanoa, she received the M. A. in L. S. degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill after earning the A. B. degree at Vassar. She is the sister of Miss Joan Moser who returns to the faculty of the music department after a year of doctoral studies at the University of Michigan.

Dr. Chorineth Rajagopalan comes from the University of Kansas to teach biology. After receiving the B. S. and M. S. degrees from the University of Saugor in his native India, Dr. Rajagopalan received the Ph.D. degree from Kansas. He has served as a research science officer at the University of Kansas, and taught at Kansas Wesleyan University prior to accepting a research position at UK to pursue his doctoral studies.

Bennett Asks Pilots To Be Extra Cautious

Brevard's Mayor Raymond F. Bennett has issued a call for pilots of private planes to "take extra precautions" during the Labor Day weekend Sept. 2-4.

In a prepared statement the mayor said that last year private pilots flew a record 3.3 billion miles in more than 105,000 aircraft "while achieving the lowest accident rate in history."

"We expect many of these pilots to be flying over the long Labor Day weekend," he added. "Just as on the highways, we ask these airmen to take extra precautions during the holiday period."

Chester W. Wells of Atlanta, area manager for the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), says that "FAA employees will be working around the clock in cooperation with the Weather Bureau and the aviation industry in order to provide extra services to pilots during this period."

Local Firemen Will Host Visiting Groups

The ninth annual WNC Firemen's Association Training School will be held here in Brevard four days beginning Monday, September 11th and ending Thursday night, September 14th.

The training school is sponsored by the WNC Firemen's Association, Asheville-Buncombe Technical Institute and the North Carolina Department of Insurance.

The Brevard Fire department, under the leadership of Chief Dan Merrill, will host the school. Classes will be held at the Brevard Fire Training Grounds on the Illahee Road near the Brevard Country Club, the Brevard Fire Station, and at the Olin Mathieson Chemical Corporation Medical Center Conference Room.

Chief Merrill, assisted by Fred Dalton, Chief of Skyland Fire Department, and F. L. McCall, of Olin Mathieson, will direct the school. The school will begin promptly at 6:36 p. m., on Monday night and 7 p. m., each night thereafter. Classes on Industrial Fire Brigade and Arson will be held at Olin Mathieson.

The Officers Fire Training and Pump Classes will be held at the Brevard station. The classes on General Fire Fighting, Group A Breathing Equipment, Group B Flammable Liquids, and Group C Ladder and Rescue, will be held at the Brevard Fire Training Grounds. Instructors for the school are as follows: Arson, Boyd Sossaman; Industrial Fire Brigade, Elwood Inscow; Officer Training, to be announced at the school; Pumps, Tom Landers; Smoke House, Mark Jones, Richard J. Silver, and Edward Greer; Flammable Liquids, Dan Merrill, Holly Oxner, and Joe Pickelsimer; Ladders & Rescue, J. D. Rhyne, Clifton Robbins, and John Bishop. Instructors assisting with the school other than those listed above will be firemen from the various departments of the WNC Association.

WNC Firemen's Association covers 24 counties divided into eight districts. Jack Leatherwood, Chief of the Black Mountain Fire Department, is President of the Association; Wofford Foster, Chief of the Tryon Fire Department, is First Vice President; and Bill Hudson, Assistant Chief of the Asheville Fire Department, is Second Vice President. Boyd Sossaman, of Sylva, is Treasurer; and Mark Jones, of Enka, is secretary of the Association.

Open competition on ladder and hose evolutions between teams of firemen from the different fire departments will be held on Thursday night, September 14th. Two fine trophies have been donated by the Olin Mathieson Chemical Corporation to be awarded to the top teams in the contest. Dan Merrill invites the public to witness demonstrations of fire fighting at the Brevard Training Grounds during these dates, especially on Thursday, September 14th.

This school is sponsored with the desire of providing an educational opportunity to the firemen of WNC in hopes it will better prepare them to protect the citizens of their communities.

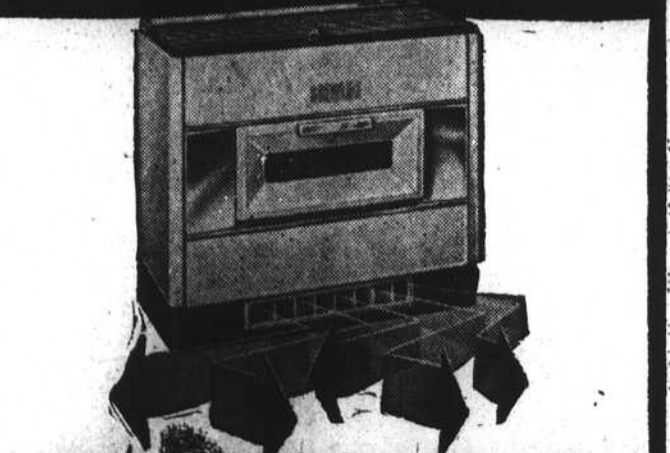
