Bennett Asks Pilots To Be **Extra Cautious**

Brevard's Mayor Raymond F. Bennett has issued a call for pilots of private planes to "take extra precautions" dur-ing the Labor Day weekend

In a prepared statement the mayor said that last year private pilots flew a record 3.3 billion miles in more than 105,000 aircraft "while achieving the lowest accident rate in history."

"We expect many of these pilots to be flying over the long Laber Day weekend," he added. "Just as on the highways ,we ask these airmen to take extra precautions during the holiday period."

Chester W. Wells of Atlanta, area manager for the Federal Aviation Administration (FFA), says that "FAA employes will be working around the clock in coopera-tion with the Weather Bureau. and the aviation industry in order to provide extra service to pilots during this period."
