Brevard And Rosman Footballers Open Home Schedules This Week



Games On Local Field Thursday, Friday Nights

The Brevard Blue Devils and the Rosman Tigers open their home football schedules in two important games here at the Transylvania County Stadium this weekend.

The Tigers get things underway first when they host Crossnore in a Thursday night encounter, and the Blue Devils open their home and Ivy conference schedule on Friday night when they take on coach Bill Rucker's undefeated Owen Warhorses.

Both games are scheduled to get underway at 8:00 p.m.

The Tigers and the Blue Devils will both be trying to rebound from opening game setbacks on the road last week. Rosman sustained an 18-7 loss at the hands of Bakersville, and the Blue Devils dropped a hard fought contest to Hendersonville, 14-6.

Both coaching staffs at the two Transylvania schools have been busy this week correcting mistakes that proved costly in their openers last week. Rosman and Brevard both fumbled their games away last week and Coaches Stanley and Cathey have no intentions of allowing repeat performances of those costly miscues.

Large crowds are expected for both games as the football season here in Transylvania swings into full gear this weekend.

The Blue Devils and the Tigers came out of their openers in pretty good physical condition, and both teams are expected to be at peak performance this weekend.

Police Chief Reports Bad Check Ring Is Broken Up

A check forgery ring has been broken up here in Brevard and Transylvania and in several adjoining towns and counties.

This report comes from Brevard's Chief of Police J. C. Rowe, who says the action was due to the fine cooperation of local police and the Transylvania sheriff's department with law enforcement officers in Buncombe, Henderson, Haywood, Jackson, Rutherford and Avery counties.

Chief Rowe says that as far as he can determine all bad checks have been made good.

John E. Gurley, who was reported to have set up Blue Ridge Industries in Brevard, was arrested in connection with the ring.

Also arrested were Mildred and Marjorie Frenzel of Cashiers, and they are in the custody of sheriff's departments in adjoining counties.

\$78,532 Project Contract Is Let To Prevent Flooding On Caldwell, Broad

The contract has been let for draining, widening and resurfacing of Caldwell and Broad streets near Brevard College where flooding is always a problem during heavy rains.

The work will be done by P. M. Alexander Construction company, of Asheville.

The cost of the project is \$78,532.00.

The Alexander company was the low bidder by about \$11,000.00.

The length of the work on the two streets is 0.421 miles, and the work will include the following: Grading, coarse

aggregate base course, bituminous concrete binder, surface and curb and gutter widening, drainage and surfacing.

The contract was awarded at the meeting of the State Highway commission on last Friday in Raleigh.
