Allen H. Sims, of Gastonia, is serving as chairman of the Board.

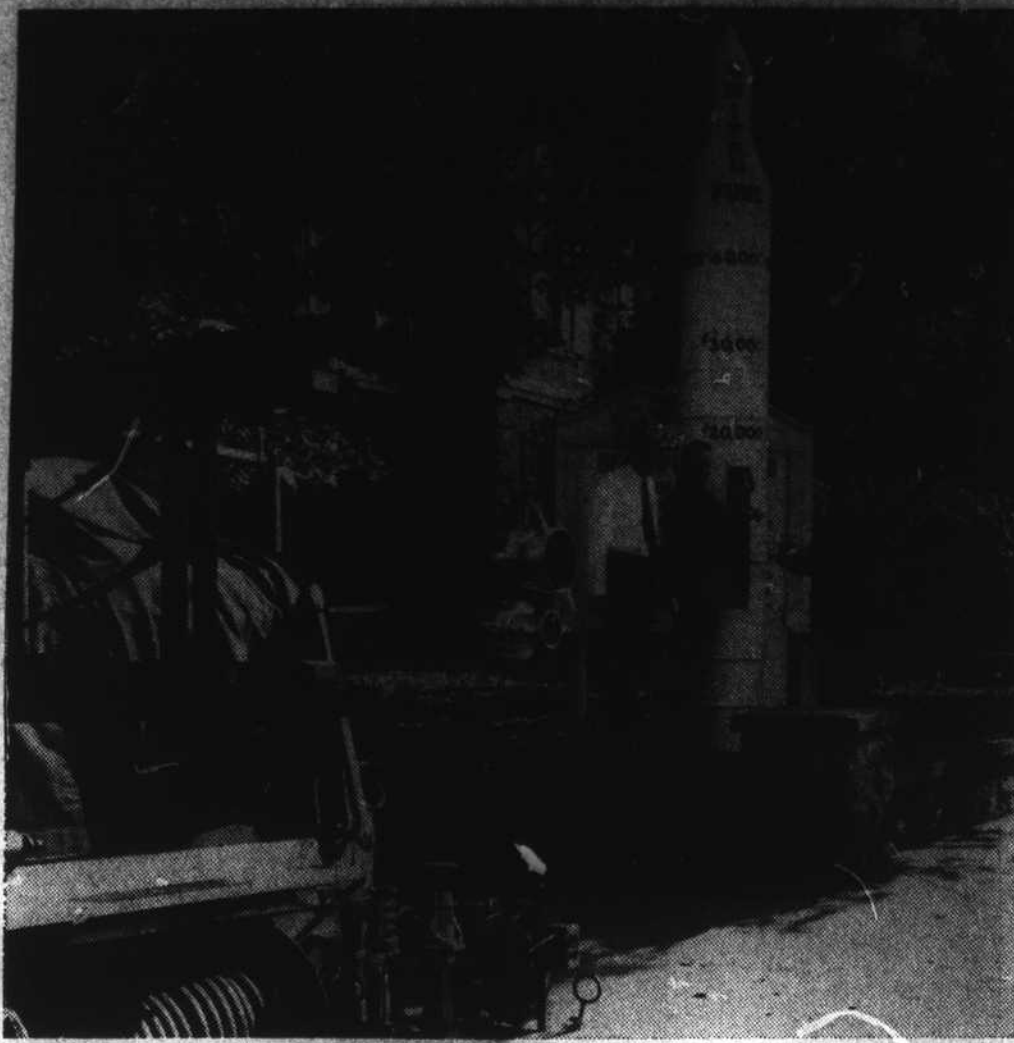

Families Own More Cars And Furnishings

The figures indicate that approximately 85.1 percent of the households in Transylvania County now own one or more automobiles, as against 76.7 percent in 1960.

Elsewhere in the United States, by comparison, 78.4 percent are car owners and, in the South Atlantic States, 77.5 percent.

The proportion of homes in the regional area equipped with clothes dryers has also gone up. Ownership has increased by about 105 percent since 1960, it is estimated.

Similarly, television sets in Transylvania County are more numerous, according to the figures. Some 84.0 percent of the households in the area have one or more sets at the present time. In 1960 it was 75.4 percent.

As to washing machines, despite the fact that there are more in use than ever before, there has been little change in the proportion of families reporting ownership since 1960.

The Commerce Department explains that this is due to an increase in the number of families living in rented dwelling units. Washing machines are frequently provided in rental housing.

Currently, an estimated 85.1 percent of local households are listed as owners of washing machines.

The report also relates ownership of household appliances to income and shows that as income per family rises, as has been the case in the local area during the seven-year period, ownership also rises.

vote is because he or she has mistaken county registration for Town registration.

Registration in the Transylvania county books does not qualify a person to vote in Town elections.

Registration in the Town books is necessary. If a person voted in the last special Town election in July of this year, their registration is correct unless they have moved since the election.

A person who did not vote in this last election should verify the correctness of his registration during the forthcoming period at Town Hall.

Transylvania County will have to re-register by signing his name to three of these sheets after the sheets are properly filled out.

It should be understood that this new loose-leaf registration system has nothing to do with a full time registration system. The present law does not require counties to have a full time registration system by 1970 or at any later date. So, the only change in our county will be the type of books used for registering.

It was also pointed out at this meeting in Asheville that the election laws have been completely recodified. This was not a rewriting of the laws but only a rearrangement with some clarification of terms used. It has eliminated many inconsistencies and has made the laws easier to understand and interpret.

I hope that this information will be helpful to your readers, Mr. Anderson, and that it will help prevent some of the confusion so often resulting from changes in the election procedures.
