Ezra apparently was apable enough, for we are told he was a "ready scribe in the law of Moses." He was a descendant of Aaron, brother of Moses, intelligently taught in the word of God, capable of leadership and skillful in using the appropriate means to accomplish his work.

Apparently Ezra was on good terms with Artaxerxes, king of Persia, for he received a commission from him to go to Judah with another detachment of Jews and put the nation in order politically and religiously. This was not a forced recoloni-
