Cancer Cures Are Up In Transylvania

By STAFF WRITER

Although cancer holds the umber two spot in Transyl-ania county among the ma-or causes of death, the hance of surviving a battle with the disease is better now than it ever was.

Today, one out of three vic-tims is being cured. And that to cancer specialists. And that ratio could be raised to one out of two, they say, if everyone saw a physician when the first symptoms appeared.

Interest in their findings, revealed at the National Can-cer Conference in Donver, is heightened by the fact that next month has been desig-nated "Cancer Control Month."

The cancer figures for the lo-area, and the way they com-re with those for other sec-as of the country, are brought

out in the latest annual report of the U.S. Public Health Service.

They show, among residents of Transylvania county, a to-tal of 19 deaths in the year from the various types of can-cer. Not included are cases in the local area involving non-residents.

It was equivalent to a rate of 106 cancer deaths per 100,-000 population, as against 154 per 100,000 in the United States as a whole and 114 in the state of North Carolina. DVRCIEN

Lung cancer, and its relation-ship to cigarette smoking, has been receiving more attention than the other forms of cancer.

This has been due to the repid increase in lung cancer mortality. With 55,00 victims in the past year, mostly men, the death rate is ten times

what it was 30 years ago.

The official figures show that lung cancer caused 18 percent of all cancer deaths in the United States and 17 percent in the state of North Carolina.

In Transylvania county, the report shows, it was respon-sible for 16 percent of them.

Slowly but surely, progress is being made in coping with certain forms of cancer, according to the National Cancer Institute,

New drugs and new combina-tions of treatment have boosted the survival rate in cases involving cancer of the colon, rectum, cervix and breast.

As to lung cancer, however, there has been little progress, The five-year survival rate is still under 10 percent. Under the circumstances, the recom-mendation is "stop smoking."
