Man Shot Five **Times Saturday** Is Recovering

John Michael Gillespie, of Atlanta, Georgia, has been released on bond in connection with the shooting of Melvin Harrill, 26, of Columbia, S. C., here last Saturday

Chief J. C. Rowe said a warrant had been issued for Gillespie charging him with assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill, inflicting bodily injury.

Harrill was shot five times with a .22 weapon while he was visiting in the home of his father-in-law, Buddy Williams, on Duckworth Avenue about 2:50 p.m. last Saturday.

He was taken to Memorial Mission Hospital in Asheville, where his condition was reported improved Tuesday

An all-points bulletin for Gillespie was issued immediately following the shooting Saturday afternoon, and he surrendered to the local police Monday morning.

His bond was set at \$2,500.

Patron Parking And More Lock **Boxes Promised**

The Post Office Depart-is seeking competitive bids to build and lease the new main post office at Brevard, Postmaster General Winton M. Elount announces.

Competitive bidding encourages the most attractive and economical offer to the Government Mr. Blount noted. This will help the Department to improve postal service while keeping expenditures low, he

Under a lease construction program, the site located at the southwest corner of West Main Street and England Street, will be assigned to the successful bidder who will control the property, con-struct the building to Department specifications and lease it to the Department for a basic period of 20 years and option of 30 years. The land and building will remain on local tax rolls. The building will contain 7,900 square feet.

The Department's capital investment will be limited substantially to postal equipment.

"We are very pleased and happy that a new Post Office for Brevard will now become a reality," says Charlie Patton, Brevard Postmas-

"We will have much more room in the new building which will enable us to give the public better service as well as provide better working conditions for Post Office employees. The new space will alleviate the present shortage of Post Office lock boxes which we've had for some time.

"We are particularly pleased, also, that the new office will provide parking spaces for postal patrons, something else we've needed for a long time," concludes Mr. Patton.
