## Representative American Speeches Are Now In The College Library

Each year about this time a volume comes from the H. W. Wilson Co. entitled *Representative American Speeches*. It is cataloged, placed in the Speech section of the Library — and rarely read. No one reads speeches anymore. Everyone makes them. Speeches, at one time, were read, dissected, memorized, and re-acted. If you could recapture the habit, you would find that speeches make good reading as well as being useful source material.

This current *Representative American Speeches: 1969 - 1970* contains some famous and provocative utterances. Here Agnew's famous speech made

before the Midwest Regional Republican committee in regard to broadcast journalism. Three speeches of Seaborg, Muskie, and Rene Dubos outline thoughts on the national conscience and environment. Margaret Chase Smith's speech entitled "Declaration of Conscience—Twenty Years Later" is here. And a speech by President Nixon, "The Pursuit of Peace," that was delivered on national television, November 3, 1969, is included. You may want to browse among famous speeches of earlier years. 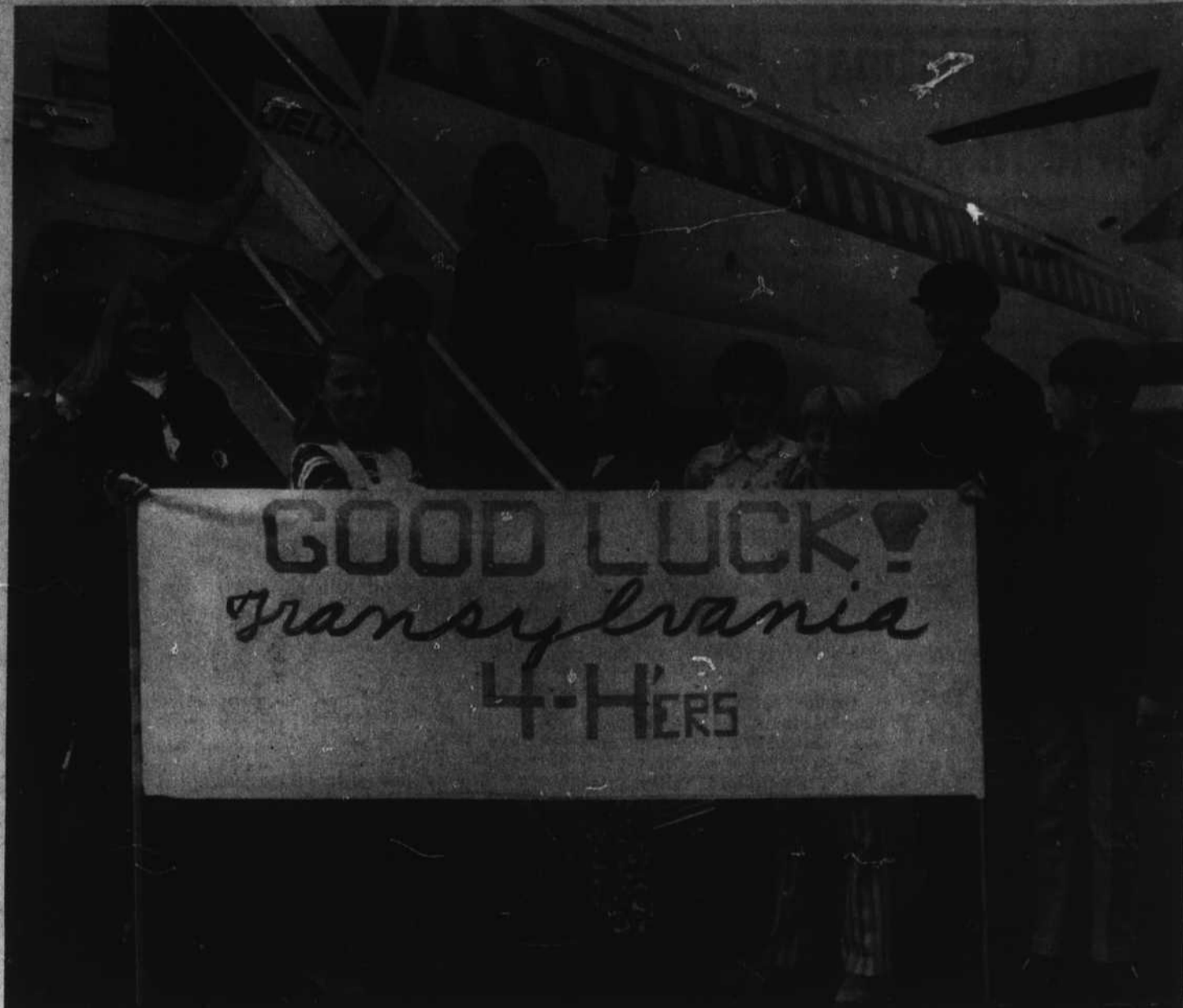
