Farmers Should Advise ASCS When Farmland Changes Hands

Farmers participating in programs administered by the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service should report to the County ASCS Office any sale or purchase of farmland, according to Glenn A. Whitmire, Chairman of the Transylvania County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service Committee.

"I strongly urge those who have added to or reduced the size of their farms to get the information to the county office as soon as possible," said Mr. Whitmire.
