

# Merrill's Masonry Clinches Industrial Basketball League Championship

The Merrill's Masonry engers won the Brevard industrial league championship last week with wins over Cardinal Cleaners and Pisgah Texaco.

The champs started the week with a 87-76 win over Cardinal Cleaners paced by Charles Owenby with 42 points. Others in double figures for Merrill's were Bill Lowe with 16 points, and Gerald Edwards with 14 points.

Jim Hendrix was high for the losers with 18 points, followed by Bill Wike with 16 and William Hooper with 12.

Merrill's then continued their winning ways with a convincing 112-37 win over Pisgah Texaco that gave them the title. Owenby, Lowe and Edwards were again high for Merrill's with 52, 16 and 16 points respectively. Sam Green was high for the losers with 10 points.

In other Industrial League games, Cardinal Cleaners whipped American Thread 64-57, with Bill Wike and Bill Hooper high for the winners with 27 and 23 points respectively. Johnny Peterson and Larry Tinsley each had 18 points to lead American Thread.

American Thread then bounced back in a later game to defeat Pisgah Texaco 76-46, paced by Bill May's 23 points. Joe Silvers was high for Pisgah Texaco with 13 points.

With one more week of play remaining, Merrill's Masonry has wrapped up the title with an unblemished record of 11-0. Cardinal Cleaners is in second place with a 7-4 record, American Thread is third with a 3-8 mark, and fourth place is held down by Pisgah Texaco with a 1-10 record.

The Handicap Committee at Glen Cannon will once again use the United States Golf Association (USGA) Handicap System. Among the purposes of the Handicap System are to:

1. Provide fair handicaps for all golfers, regardless of ability; reflect the players inherent ability as well as his recent scoring trends; automatically adjust his handicap down or up as his game changes; disregard freak high scores that bear little relation to the players normal ability; make it difficult for the player to obtain an unfairly large handicap increase at any revision period; make a handicap continuous from one playing season to the next without need of adjustment; encourage the player to keep his game near its peak; establish handicaps useful for all golf, from championship eligibility to informal games.

Golfers who participated in the USGA system in 1970, do not need to re-enter for the 1971 season. Those interested in establishing and maintaining an official handicap are encouraged to register at the pro shop.

The Tournament Committee has tentative plans to award a low gross and low net champion in the men's 1971 club championship tournament, and the USGA system will apply.

USGA Definitions  
1. Gross score—Is a player's actual score before it is adjusted by his handicap.  
2. Handicap—Is the number which permit improving the lie

of artificial strokes a player receives to adjust his scoring ability to the common level of scratch or zero-handicap golf.

3. Handicap allowance — Is the portion of the handicap usable in a given form of play.

4. Handicap controls — are checks and balances in the handicap system to offset abnormal scoring.

5. Handicap differential — is the difference between a player's gross score and the course rating of the course on which the score was made.  
6. Handicap stroke hole — is a hole on which a player applies a handicap stroke to his gross score. The numerical order in which handicap strokes are allocated to the holes of the course are shown on the score cards.

7. Net score — is a player's score after his gross score has been adjusted by his handicap.

8. Par — is the score that an expert golfer would be expected to make for a given hole. Par means errorless play without flukes and under ordinary weather conditions, allowing two strokes on the putting green. Par is based on yardage recommended by the USGA.

9. Course rating — is the evaluation of the playing difficulty of a course compared with other rated courses.

10. "Preferred lies" and "winter rules" — are local rules which permit improving the lie

of the ball in a specified way without penalty.

Dr. W. A. Davis, Ron Brewer and Charlie Brewer were recently selected to the Rules Committee for the men's low-ball team matches at Glen Cannon.

Members who play in these matches are required to register prior to 12:30 on Wednesday, Saturday, Sunday and holidays. A complete set of rules are posted on the pro shop bulletin board.

On March 7th, Walter Clayton, J. P. Jones, Jim Chapman and Marshall Gillespie won honors with a front nine score of 35.

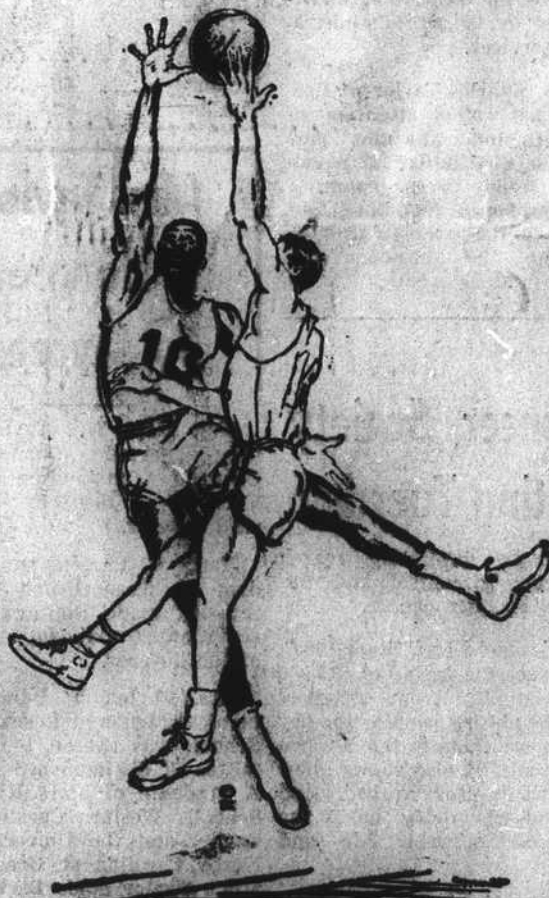
