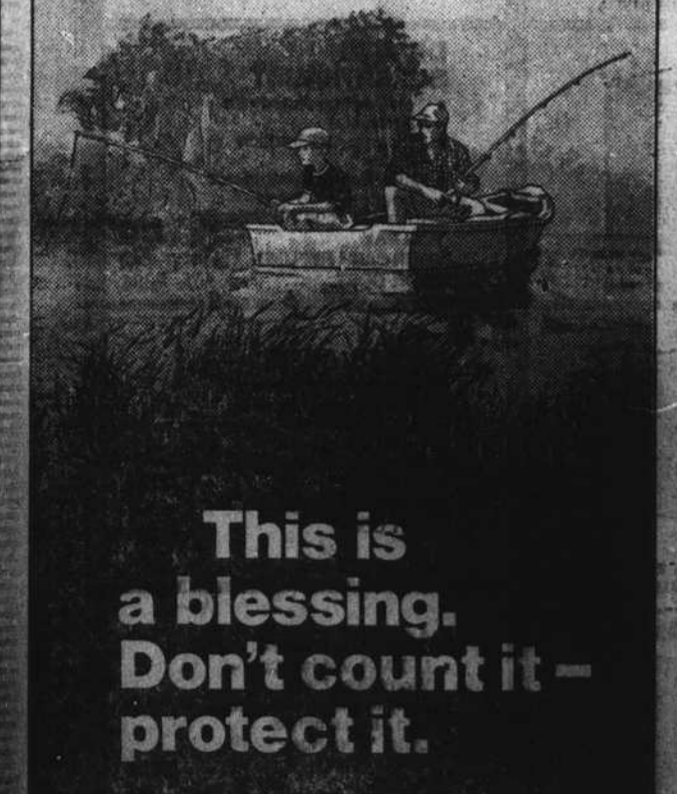
### Tornado Thinclads Win Third Meet, Run Again Here Thursday

Ed Williams set two new door records and accumulated 14 1/2 points to lead Brevard Junior College to an easy, 86-57 track and field victory over Milligan College here Monday afternoon.

Williams won the triple jump with a leap of 46 feet, 2 1/2 inches and the broad jump in 22 feet, 11 1/2 inches, both new outdoor records for Brevard. Williams was also second in the 220-yard dash and on the winning relay team in the 440-yard dash.

Three other Brevard performers were double winners for coach Norm Witek's charges.

Little League players who were born between 8/1/58 and 7/31/61 (ages 10-11-12) will report to E. L. Lynn field in Pisgah Forest.

Babe Ruth applicants who were born between 8/1/55 and 7/31/58 (ages 13-14-15) will be eligible to tryout at the L. F. Dixon Field in Pisgah Forest.

Tryouts for the Minor League baseball teams will be held at the VFW field on April 17th and April 24th at 10:00 a.m. for boys who were born between 8/1/60 and 7/31/63 (ages 8-9-10).

Application forms may be obtained at Groves Launderette on Caldwell Street.

The form should be completely filled in, signed by both parents, if possible, and brought to the field on Saturday.

These tryouts are only for boys who have not previously played baseball in Transylvania County. Boys already team members will be notified by their managers when practice will start.

Boys who have completed their eligibility in the Little League and Babe Ruth League are urged to turn in their uniforms at once so they may be assigned to new players upon completion of the player draft.

Application blanks will soon be available at most of the WNC area pro shops for caddies in the \$35,000 Kemper Pro Tournament, which is slated for June 10-11-12-13 at the Etowah Valley Golf Club.

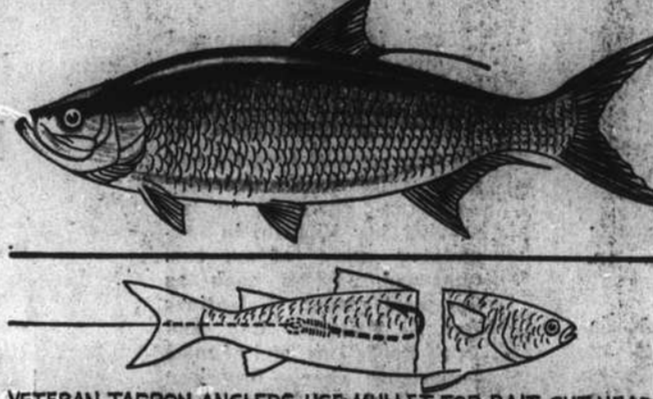
