## Nelson Makes State Finals In Discus

Gary Nelson will be Brevard's lone representative in the big NCHSAA state track meet finals in Raleigh this weekend.

State finalists were determined here on the Brevard College track last Friday when 69 high schools sent teams here to compete in the state regional meet.

In that meet, schools from as far east as Greensboro, High Point, Winston-Salem and Reidsville competed here, with Charlotte Myers Park winning Class II honors and Hendersonville walking off with the Class I crown.

Nelson placed fourth here in the discus to qualify for the state finals in that event.

Over 250 of the finest high school athletes in the state were on hand here to compete in the regional meet, but only a select few made the finals to Raleigh this weekend. Only the first four finishers in each event made the finals.
